Give thanks for the Congregation Board, that they be blessed with wisdom in their decision about the various work and projects being done concerning the church facilities.


Pray for world peace, we ask for wisdom for our leaders that they make appropriate decisions on behalf of all of us.

Vision Meeting 27th September

The fund raising team were greatly encouraged by both the turn out and the enthusiasm of those in attendance at the Vision meeting looking towards the future of Crown Church.

The meeting began with an update from Bill Mein on the proposals to renovate the large MacGilp stained glass window. This was supported by enlarged photos of the existing window and a mock up of what the refurbished window could look like.

The meeting then went on to discuss other options to upgrade and refurbish parts of the church. This was introduced by a presentations and slides on what had been achieved in a some other churches, namely Mannofield Aberdeen, United Reform Nairn, St Andrews Arbroath.

A general discussion ensued which had a number of contributors expressing a variety of views with sincerity and conviction.

Jimmy Gray who assisted in the Vision presentation and chaired the meeting later reflected that he was encouraged by the outcome. "I really did not know what to expect as a huge amount of emotion and strong sentiments are generally and understandably connected to church buildings. However I was delighted that although different opinions were expressed what came through very strongly was the absolute commitment and strong sense of ownership from those in attendance along with the willingness to look to the future of the church in Crown".

The areas where there was general agreement was the need to improve disabled access, the kitchens, the toilets and the halls.



It is now proposed to hold further meetings with the general congregation and also with halls users.

The fund raising team would very much appreciate any ideas or thoughts of anyone in the congregation or the wider community.

'Reclaimed Territory' is an annual visit to Scotland by Claudius England, mostly focused on the Central Belt but now including Inverness as a regular destination. The Reclaimed Territory initiative is both a cultural sharing, motivational and empowering speaking with a strong religious underpinning. Schools, churches, community groups of all sorts and detention centres such as Inverness Prison are all included. Claudius first visited Inverness in 2016 and this time was able to further develop his links with prison, Crown Church, with Millburn Academy and revisit CYC - now Youth for Christ. New strands include Nairn, with potential for Book & Arts Festival link, culture exchanging with Ardersier Folk Club and linking with Bishop Eden Primary and Inshes Church youth group as well as exploring future contact with Culduthel Christian Centre.

Huge thanks to everyone who hosted, made links for, or otherwise welcomed Claudius and Veshone, with a very special mention to Rona Tynan for her lovely hospitality, including freshly baked scones, coffee and a very special jammin' session.



RARE MOMENT OF HAPPINESS FOR FAMILIES IN WINTER POVERTY

A box full of gifts would put a smile on the face of any child but for four-year-old Vince it produced a rare moment of joy.

Poverty and domestic instability are all that he has ever known. He has never met his father but his mother does her best to provide a clean and tidy home for her four children, in Bekes, eastern Hungary

Shoebox distributor Anikó Somlyai explains: "There is running water and electricity in their town, but after paying the bills many families have nothing left to live on, especially in winter. Many are jobless and dependent on unemployment and social benefits.

"So your shoebox gifts mean a lot to them. In this town we were able to hand out 320 boxes to families in need."

Blythswood Care's 2017 Shoe Box Appeal resulted in 115,932 boxes being sent to eight countries in Eastern Europe and to Pakistan. The boxes were filled with practical gifts such as a warm hat, a bar of soap, a packet of sweets – everyday items for people in the UK but unaffordable luxuries for many who live in poverty.

They were contributed by schools, workplaces, churches and individuals from Shetland to Cornwall.

"Often people say to me, 'Why do people make up a shoebox for me?"" says Blythswood's chief executive James Campbell. "And I tell them it's because of the love that people like

you, here in the UK, have for those that you don't even know. "It's such a privilege to be able to deliver them on your behalf.


