From the Minister

On Sunday May 31, Rt Rev Dr Martin Fair, the Moderator of the General Assembly, led an online worship service to celebrate the Day Of Pentecost, the birthday of the church.

This year was different, of course. Not only are we all so well a-tuned to 'online worship' that it was feasible – I imagine for the first time ever – to hold a single service on a Sunday morning, to unite together the whole Church of Scotland and many friends, frae a' the airts and pairts and beyond.



Just as 'online worship' has no geographical boundaries, Martin took us outside our normal geographical location of church, which is usually constrained by 4 walls (and in the case of Crown Church, an awful lot of doors), and into the freedom, the liberation and exhilaration and God's beautiful creation in the mountains and glens of Bonnie Scotland.

One of the things he did in preparation for this service was to ask parishes around the country to send him thoughts in exactly 7 words, about what 'the church' means to them. These were then flashed across our screens during the service, but unless you paused the video you probably didn't get enough of a chance to really appreciate and contemplate them.

Well, a parishioner in Cambusbarron Bruce Memorial Church decided to write a poem to express her thoughts about what 'the church' is, or does, or should do, following the same idea of each line containing exactly 7 words. Not an easy feat, I imagine, but the effort was worth it. I share it here with permission:

Bringing the good news to every nation Sharing God's love, His purpose, His might Bearing witness to the joy of salvation In our human darkness, shining God's light.

Spreading the gospel to all God's people Taking care of our elders, our youth Proclaiming His glory from steeple to steeple Opening hearts to the Spirit of Truth.

Praising our Lord, our Father in heaven

Forgiving our debtors, as we are forgiven
Embracing the stranger who happens our way.

Praying to God for comfort in sorrow



The date was set for 29/05 (the day they should have been arriving in Malawi) and Douglas kindly announced it during the Service on 24th.






On the 23rd May Ryan and Isla made chocolate strawberries at home and thought about children in Malawi.

For example, the expression below is 'Fit as a Fiddle'. Our thanks to Eileen Ardern for the Quiz. Answers are on page 14.























Thy Kingdom Come
