From the Minister

Dear friends,

You know you're in Scotland when people start dressing for summer as soon as the temperature hits 13°C. I'm sitting in a coffee shop drinking a massive mug of coffee and using their free WiFi. People are walking past in shorts and t-shirts while I still need a jumper. Maybe it's the air conditioning. Maybe I just lived in Australia for too long.



Treating myself to an occasional regular! coffee in a coffee shop is just one of the many privileges that I enjoy, and I think many of you do too. We live in a time and place which is both peaceful and wealthy, which is what affords us these privileges. Of course neither our peace nor our wealth is perfect, there are many life situations that cause us stress or anxiety or emotional turmoil, but compared to history, and compared to many other parts of the world, we are incredibly blessed by God to enjoy the levels of peace and wealth that we do have.

I was thinking about this while reading some material about the Jewish celebration of Sukkot. It doesn't come around this year until October, so it seems a little bit out of place during Lent. Lent leads us towards Easter, which in the Jewish calendar would be most obviously matched with Passover.

But it was as I reflected on the self-imposed deprivation that Jesus suffered in the wilderness – which is the foundation for our season of Lent – my mind was drawn to the festival of Sukkot, a time when devout Jews self-impose an element of deprivation.

For a week they will live in temporary huts, or booths, usually erected in their garden. These symbolise the time when the nation of Israel wandered in the wilderness for 40 years – which is also reflected in the 40 days that Jesus spent in the wilderness. During that time they lived in simple tents that could be easily dismantled and moved and they relied on God for everything, manna (bread) from heaven and water from the springs that he drew out of the ground.

While Jews around the world have hardly had peace from persecution throughout the last 2000 years, nevertheless they worried that as they became more settled and affluent they might become complacent in their faith, they might become slaves to the world's riches – like the temptations Jesus faced – while neglecting the worship of God. So every year they have a festival in which they acknowledge the fragility of human life and achievements, and humbly admit their utter reliance on God for every element of life.

We too must never become complacent in our faith. We don't have a traditional festival quite as ingrained or structured as the Jewish festival of Sukkot, but Lent is intended to be a similar kind of step back from our everyday life and habits, to reflect more deeply on our relationship with God and our dependence upon his grace.

"Humanity shall not live by bread alone," said Jesus, "but by every word that comes from the mouth of God."

We have decided to curtail these meetings at present as there are other opportunities to meet.



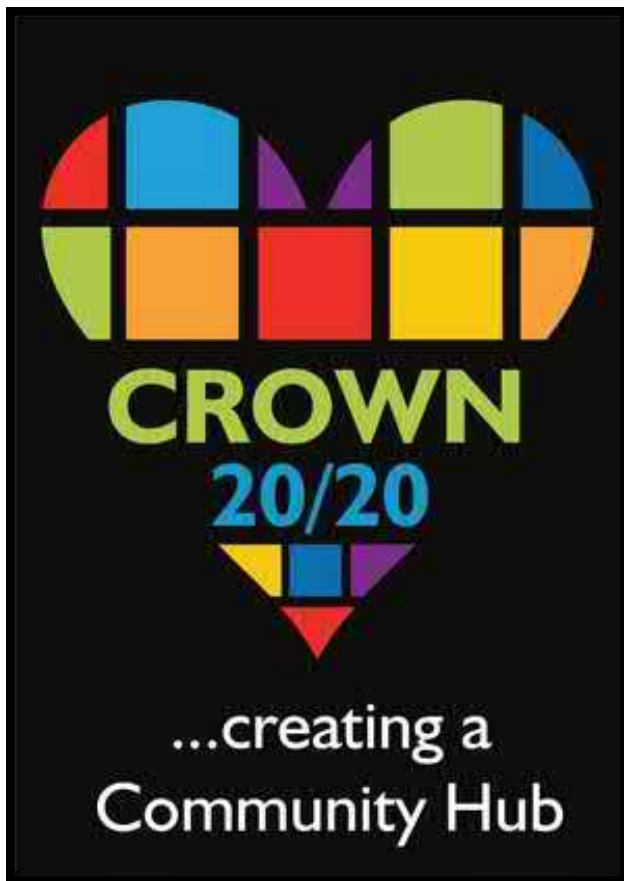

Update from Crown 20/20 Group

“Crown Church aims to invest in a major upgrade of our church buildings to provide a warm and welcoming home for worship, equip us with modern and accessible Facilities to support Christian outreach into our community and to help our church meet the needs of that community.”

Dear Members of the Congregation

It's always good to begin with good news so we are delighted to confirm we have received the offer of a grant of £74,343 from the Place-Based Investment Programme to carry out some of the necessary repairs and upgrades to the church. This is a fund administered by The Highland Council on behalf of the Scottish Government to support capital projects which deliver on community-led regeneration.

Our project fitted the bill as our aim is to regenerate our wonderful historic building to make it a community hub, benefiting not only members of our congregation but the wider community.

Subject to Presbytery approval, this award will allow us to upgrade the lighting and the audio visual equipment in the Sanctuary and will ensure that we can livestream our church services without the outages which we have experienced all too often with our current outmoded equipment.

We also intend to improve access to our attic with wider walkways and provision of handrails and improve the insulation there. Secondary double glazing will be installed in The McGilp window to reduce heat loss.

Meanwhile, in the Lower Hall, Morrison Construction have issued their final programme for works they are carrying out to create a two-roomed nursery for Crown Primary, and now expect the completion certificate to be available on Friday 29 April.

The lift to the refurbished Upper Hall is now being installed during the week beginning Monday 4 April. We hope to hold an Open Day on Saturday 7th May when the congregation and the community can look over the nurseries and all the church premises.

We were delighted to return to the Sanctuary on Sunday 27 March following completion of the works to remove the pews and level the floor and the re-siting of the organ and the sound equipment. Delivery of our new chairs for the Sanctuary have been delayed until May but we are pleased to have secured the loan of chairs from Dingwall Town Hall. The heating pipes which run along the wall under the MacGilp window will be hidden by cupboards designed to allow the heat to escape.

So, good news and good progress to report as we look forward to all that Easter brings.

Christian Aid Week 2022 15-21 May

The logo is familiar. Along with the daffodils that are gracing our gardens, it is a sign of spring.

It is therefore time to let you know that Christian Aid Week will be taking place again this year, as it did during the last two years of pandemic. However this year I am hoping that we can be a little bit more outgoing. By outgoing I mean going out. Putting the familiar red donation envelopes through letterboxes to raise money for the world's poorest, so that Christian Aid can respond to emergency, facilitate development projects and fight injustice against the poor.

This year the envelopes will be "delivery only". Each envelope will contain information to householders about the various ways that they can donate, some online, some by depositing their envelope in local shops etc. This will mean that volunteers will not have to go back to ask for filled envelopes. In the past I have resisted such a change because I have felt that amounts collected would be less. However according to Christian Aid, it is effective. It should be a great deal easier (and quicker) for volunteers and therefore a great deal easier for me. I won't have to twist so many arms to get volunteers...I hope! Please prove me right! Or prepare for sore arms!

This simpler variant of the door-to-door collection will be the main plank of our effort this year, supplemented by online giving, but once again I hope personally to undertake the "300,000 steps in May" challenge. Would anyone else like to do this? Last year I found it rewarding in all sorts of ways. You do it at your own pace. You don't even need to find sponsors because I will provide you with a Just Giving link which you simply send to your friends and relatives, nearby and far away. Delivering envelopes could kick start your step count!

Look out for more details in the coming weeks and in the May newsletter.

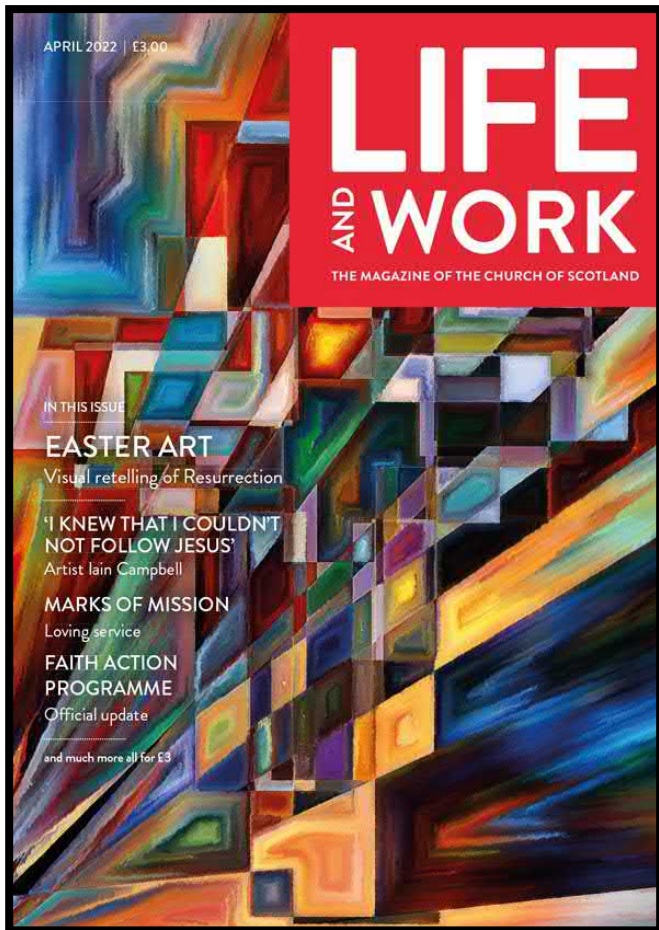
