Update from Crown 20/20 Group

"Crown Church aims to invest in a major upgrade of our church buildings to provide a warm and welcoming home for worship, equip us with modern and accessible

Facilities to support Christian outreach into our community and to help our church meet the needs of that community."

Dear Members of the Congregation

Given the extent and complexity of the work undertaken to reconfigure our historic church building in recent times, it is perhaps not unsurprising that the timetable for completion of the Lower Hall into a nursery unit for Crown Primary School has been set back again.

We had hoped the Lower Hall contract would be completed by 29 April, but the latest update from The Highland Council is that a more realistic date for completion is 3rd June with the aim of opening the nursery unit in time for the start of the new school session in mid-August.

We are advised that parts are awaited for the fire escape windows and that scaffolding cannot be removed until the fire escape is finished, and therefore the ground around the scaffolding cannot be made good. Internally the work is 95% complete, and looking good. Unfortunately none of the areas downstairs - kitchen, toilets etc. can be used by us until there is a completion certificate.

A possible new date for an Open Day, when we throw open the doors of the new facilities, is Saturday 13th August - the weekend before the new school session begins.

Since the last newsletter, the new 8-person lift has been installed, and will create an accessible link to the Upper Hall. The pews in the central area of the Sanctuary have been removed, the organ relocated to nearer the AV screen, and the new flooring laid and polished.

The new flexibility of the Sanctuary is shown here where it is ready for the toddler groups, run by Young Crown on Wednesday and Thursday mornings. Lots of space for driving in the little cars!

Over the last four Sundays, we have been back in the Sanctuary for Sunday services and have been using individual folding seats borrowed form Dingwall Town Hall. Our own new seats will be arriving at the end of May.

Half of the new seats will have arm rests, which will be welcomed by many members of the congregation. We are delighted that the Congregational Board has agreed to purchase 10 tables -the same style as the eight we currently have on loan in the Sanctuary. It has been a very useful exercise to have borrowed these as it has shown how much they are needed at both the 9.30 service and after the 11 o'clock service for coffee, and will be much used as the Sanctuary is increasingly booked up for a wide variety of mid-week activities.

Work pending in the Sanctuary is the installation of cupboards which will mask the heating pipes under the MacGilp window and provide additional storage.

Work is also planned once permissions have been obtained to upgrade the lighting and audio/visual system in the Sanctuary thanks to a grant of £74,343 from the Place-Based Investment Programme - administered by The Highland Council on behalf of the Scottish Government. This will ensure that we can livestream our church services without the outages which we have experienced all too often with our current outmoded equipment.

We also intend to improve access to our attic with wider walkways and provision of handrails and improve the insulation there. Secondary double glazing will be installed in the MacGilp window to reduce heat loss. Three consultants will be submitting lighting plans within the next couple of weeks for our consideration. A small team of those most involved with the AV equipment, with the professional input of Andy Belby of Pro Media who installed the AV in the Upper Hall, will work on choosing from the latest technology available.

The lounge is being given a facelift in a joint effort by the Olive Grove and some of the Crown 20/20 team, and will soon be a light, bright space for small group meetings. During the day on Wednesdays and Thursdays the Olive Grove team are hoping to welcome back many of their former customers as well as attract new ones. Good weather will see tables on our sunny lawn.

Another busy update as we work relentlessly to deliver the aims of our ambitious project.

Pray that just as God loves and cares for us, we would also similarly love and care for others. Help us to be loyal to those who need us.



Serving Inverness with distinction and friendliness

In Crown Church Newsletter for September 2009 I used this heading to salute Jimmy Gray's appointment as Provost of Inverness in a team with his wife, Liz, as Lady Provost.

The same headline is just as appropriate now as we mark Jimmy's retirement after over 20 years with The Highland Council as one of the Members for the Millburn Ward and Convener of the South Area Planning Committee amongst many Convenerships.



He also steered the Inverness Townscape Heritage Project, the catalyst for many splendid improvements to, and greater knowledge of, our built environment particularly in Academy Street.

Jimmy was elected to The Highland Council for the Crown Ward in 1999. Nothing ever stays still in life and this was subsequently reorganised and renamed as Millburn Ward. His 1st May 2003 election address "Jimmy Gray's BUSY DIARY of REAL local PROGRESS as your Councillor" focuses on recently improving the schools and on new plans to upgrade the carriageway of Stephens Brae for pedestrians. En passant he mentions that with another Councillor they were successful in getting a £20k grant from the Highland Council Landfill Tax Credit Fund to assist Crown Church to pay for a much needed new boiler.

Jimmy has worked tirelessly and with great integrity for this part of the new "city" and for Crown Church as a vital part of the community. He is the energetic and hands-on Chairman of our 20/20 Committee which is now completing the impressive major upgrade to all our premises. This has certainly given the church and community a "LIFT".

This same active approach is often also seen in sweeping up after others whether it be in the streets on his early morning run or in his attention to sweeping the church floors after coffee on a Sunday.

He and Liz have put in many, partly unseen, hours of work for the Crown Church fixing and painting, housekeeping etc. which are on top of their designated positions within the church.

We salute them both.



The ceremony took place in The Medal Room of Dingwall Museum on Wednesday 2nd March 2022 and a photograph of the medal awarded is shown below.

The award was originally announced in the Queen's Birthday Honours list of 2020 but because of COVID and other factors there had been a long delay in organising the actual presentation of the medal.

The award was made because of Bob's work as Chairman of the Seaforth Highlanders Regimental Association (Ross-shire Branch) and his links, over the years, with a number of bodies including the Consulates of Poland and Japan.



Drought starves. It robs people of the power to farm and grow food for their families. Now too, for the first time in a generation, global poverty is rising. Covid-19, conflict and the climate crisis are pushing more of our global neighbours into a struggle for survival.

Women and men in Zimbabwe are hungry to provide a more hopeful future. Mothers often skip meals to share with their children what little food they have. One of these mothers is Jessica Mwedzi. 'My children crave a good meal, but I can't provide.' Jessica says. 'It pains me to send them to bed hungry.'

Highland Malawi Trust (HMT)

Dear friends and loyal supporters this is not an easy post to write.

Last month Highland Malawi Trust (HMT) transferred money to Mr Lupia our dear friend and manager of Trust affairs on the ground in Mzuzu for the last time. The money was what was left in the bank after the amazing response to our Christmas Appeal in 2020.

That appeal funded the feeding programme for all the groups in 2020 and 2021 and also provided fertiliser for the maize planting. They had bumper crops last year and we hope and pray that that will be the case this year too. There was also enough money to renovate a building that had been damaged in the January storms and also pay school fees for the Lupia family for this Session.

When HMT was set up in 2009 we never once envisaged just how big it would grow or how many lives it would affect.

Winding up the Trust was not a decision that was taken lightly and has been on the cards for a while. We achieved more than we ever envisaged and our trip in 2020 (which unfortunately never happened) was going to be our last.

The intention was to wind up then, but Covid struck and we thought "we can't do it now - we need to see them through it, if we can" and with your help as always, we did.

Losing Doug in 2020 was a huge blow and we lost out IT expert then. Brian our hardworking accountant is retiring this Summer - it will be good for him to hang up his Trust hat too. His work was unseen but it was also time consuming and the Maidens were always glad of his steadying hand on the tiller when perhaps they were getting carried away!

We will keep in touch with Mr Lupia who will keep us informed of how the groups are getting on. Hopefully what we have put in place for them will keep them going as long as they can themselves.

It has been an amazing experience for the Maidens and we shall treasure the memories of our HMT years forever .

We could not have done it alone however, so as this chapter closes our love and heartfelt thanks is sent to you all.
