From the Minister

Dear Members and Friends of Crown Church,

On Sunday (Nov 24) I mentioned that it was the last Sunday of the year.

We think of "years" in many different ways. The calendar year, from January 1st to December 31st is of course the most common, but sometimes we also think of the school year, the tax year, or the football season.

The Christian year begins on the first Sunday of Advent, a time of preparation for the coming celebrations of the birth of Jesus. When the year is set out in a lectionary, it follows



a deliberately constructed cycle to ensure that in our public worship and private devotions we cover all the major events in the life and work of Jesus, with relevant connections to Old Testament stories and the New Testament letters, every year.

So in some ways, Advent is not just a time of preparing to celebrate the birth of Jesus, but as the New Year commences it should encourage us to think of every week, every day even, as a time of preparation to meet afresh our Lord and Saviour and to be amazed at what he can do in the lives of ordinary people.

As the days and nights get colder, may our hearts grow warmer; and may the bright lights of Christmas shine constantly in our lives.

Prayer Diary

December 2024 and January 2025

This prayer diary has been prepared by the Discipleship Team. We hope that you will find it useful. You may like to detach it from the newsletter and use it to pray for our church and community

December 8 - 14

Give thanks to God for the Advent season as we wait in anticipation with Hope, Peace, Joy and Love for the celebration of the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Pray for the homeless and those cut off from their families, in particular during those long cold winter months, that practical help be made available to meet both their physical and spiritual needs.

Pray for all those in different parts of the world whose lives and livelihood have been affected by natural disasters, such as forest fires, floods and storms. Pray for support to enable them to rebuild their lives.

Pray today for people who have recently suffered bereavement – particularly those who are mourning a family member. Ask God to give them His comfort, strength and hope as they grieve, and to know He is their comforter.

December 15 - 21

Pray for all elderly people in our community, for those living in their own homes or nursing homes and care homes. Pray for strength, resilience and peace among them, their families and staff who support and help look after them.

Pray for those who live alone and are lonely. Pray also for people affected by mental illness, and ask that God will grant them strength and hope for the future.

Give thanks for the opportunities that God has provided for Crown Church to be involved in some of our local schools. Pray for our Youth and Community Worker Jackie and the work of Young Crown. Pray that this side of our work continues to flourish and grow, and touch young lives, providing healing and restoration so that they can enjoy their childhood, adolescence and harness hope for their future.

Remember those in prison and pray they may feel a sense of peace and purpose as they serve their sentence. Pray that they can maintain a positive relationship with their families, wherever possible, and remembering those who have no visitors.

December 22 - 28

Pray Psalm 33: 20-22: "We wait in hope for the Lord; He is our help and our shield. In Him our hearts rejoice, for we trust in His Holy name. May Your unfailing love be with us Lord, even as we put our hope in You."

Pray for those who will find the coming festive season difficult; those who have lost loved ones recently and are facing the first Christmas without them or those who spend the festive period alone. Pray that God will be with them all and provide comfort.

We rejoice at the Christmas story and give thanks for the birth of Jesus, and knowing that He came on earth and died to save us. Pray that the real meaning of Christmas is not missed, and that the precious truth remains a reality in the hearts and lives of everyone.

Pray Isaiah 9:6: "For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on His shoulders. And He will be called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace".

December 29 – January 4

Give thanks to God for the New Year ahead, and hope and pray that each day of the coming year be filled with joy, peace and love.

Pray for all who are in care or nursing homes and for their families, friends and relatives. Give thanks for the dedications of the staff who work hard together to ensure the well-being of all people in those homes.

Pray for the ongoing work of **Crown 20/20** and for everyone involved in the development of the church facilities for supporting mission and Christian outreach in our community; Pray for the much-needed resources, the generosity of our congregation and blessings for realisation of the project.

Pray Romans 8:39. 'Whether in heights or depths, light or darkness, may you never forget God's unending love for you'.

<u>January 5 - 11</u>

Pray for our hospitals. Thank God for the medical staff at our local hospital. Praise Him for the NHS and ask Him to lift the burden of busy workloads and long hours and to give the staff strength, joy and stamina to work hard and deliver excellent care to their patients.

Lift up the emergency services today and pray for the people in our daily lives who we often take for granted. Thank God for the everyday heroes who risk so much for us so that we can live safe lives, and pray for opportunities to thank them ourselves.

Give thanks for the Street Pastors and pray for spiritual guidance and strength for the work they do in helping and supporting vulnerable people in our town late in the nights.

Lift up people who have a difficult relationship with their family, and pray that God will touch their hearts and minds for help with mending broken relationships.

<u>January 12 - 18</u>

Pray Philippians 4:6-7: "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your request to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus."

Pray for all those living with addictions; for assurance that there is a way forward and that they can lead strong and fulfilling lives.

Pray for peace in our world; that all people may live free from violence, in safety and security, and with hope for the future. We ask for wisdom for our leaders that they make appropriate decisions on behalf of all of us. While we pray to you, O Lord, for an end to violence and the establishment of peace, we also call for you to bring justice and equity to the peoples.

Pray for people who have been displaced due to conflicts; Give thanks for those who have been able to travel to safety and pray for support for them to adjust to a new life.

<u>January 19 - 25</u>

Pray for practical and political help for all those suffering from fuel poverty and for those most at risk in the cold. Ask God to open our eyes to neighbours or other people in our community who are perhaps struggling to heat their homes, and whether there's anything we can do to help.

Pray for God's light and love to shine into the minds of all who are depressed, anxious or suffering from dementia.

Lord Jesus, You come to us as Prince of Peace. Teach us to know Your reconciling way. Help us to be curious about others' stories. Give us the courage to be present. Inspire us to reimagine what's possible – finding hope by glimpsing You at work. Amen

Pray for people living in fear in their own homes to be able to ask for help. Ask God to provide help for healing of the physical and psychological wounds of those who are suffering domestic violence, and pray for health and social care services, and the police, to be able to keep vulnerable people safe.

<u> January 26 – February 1</u>

Thank and praise God for all the children and young people in our churches, communities, country and the world. Ask that God will walk alongside them and grant them courage, strength and wisdom as they face the challenges of life.

Lord, help us not to lean on our own understanding but in everything acknowledge You so that You can direct our words, thoughts and actions, In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Father we lift up the leaders of our country and all those that You have set up in places of authority to rule and govern our nation; for wisdom and guidance in making decision about the future of the country and well-being of the people.

Pray for those who are persecuted and imprisoned because of their faith; give them courage to face their struggles, patience to bear the lies, and hope to see beyond the bars. May we do all we can to let them know that they are not forgotten.

January 29 – February 4

Offer a prayer of personal thanks to God today: Lord, I thank You for prayer – that I can come before You and call You Father; that You listen to me and care about everything I bring before You. Today, above all else, I choose to give You thanks.

Pray for God's revival in our community and congregation. Ask God to open the eyes of the people around us, that they would see His unfailing love and sense His powerful presence and purpose for our lives. Pray for each and every member of the congregation, that God's spirit continues to flow throughout their lives whatever their circumstances; Pray that each of us will place God at the centre of our lives and seek Him and His purpose in our lives. Pray for our neighbours, for people who live alone, for people who are struggling with illness and for God's peace to fall on them. Pray for protection and safety over our neighbours' homes and families, and ask God to give us opportunities and courage to share His love with those around us.





Firmly Planted - collect your stamps to support Malawi project.



Help the Church of Central Africa Presbyterian (CCAP) improve nutrition, improve agricultural productivity, create youth employment and mitigate the impact of the climate crisis.

The CCAP project, Firmly Planted aims to establish self-sustaining tree nurseries to nurture and protect the environment and protect livelihoods for households and communities.

`Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up.' Galatians $6{:}9$

Firmly Planted: Agroforestry for Sustainability

Firmly Planted is a community-based agroforestry initiative with the ambition of making a sustainable impact across Malawi, Zambia and Zimbabwe. It is spearheaded by our partners in the Church of Central Africa Presbyterian (CCAP), and built around the church's community structures. The initiative will resource individual groups to respond to the various challenges affecting Malawi today. Agroforestry presents an opportunity to address challenges of food insecurity, deforestation, climate change and youth unemployment. Tree nurseries create employment opportunities, fruit trees improve nutrition and wider tree planting helps mitigate the impact of the climate crisis, in turn improving agricultural productivity.

Firmly Planted will provide community-based training tailored to the community's needs, ensuring woodlots are well maintained to have the greatest chance to thrive. The programme, through effective distribution, looks to attain large-scale tree planting of locally relevant woodlots – these could be linked to schools, churches, clinics and community groups. Having already established a pilot tree nursery, CCAP is looking to replicate this across the Synods by implementing Central Tree Nursery Hubs allowing each nursery to grow tree seedlings based on the needs of their communities.

Our mission partner, Gary Brough, is one of the project coordinators and is looking for opportunities to grow the project. You can keep up to date with Gary's work on the Mission Partner page of the website. The Guild is also involved in supporting this programme.

This year stamp appeal proceeds will go towards establishing the tree nurseries.

The Church is continuing to use the sale of stamps to fund its international work.

If you wish to support the Crown Church's contribution to this work please collect stamps from your mail and drop them into the collection boxes in the vestibules of the church. Please separate the stamps into different bags for UK and other countries.
