Registered Charity No. SC035073 THOUGHTS FROM REV JAMES As you're reading this, Holy week and Easter Sunday is fast approaching. It's still my favourite part of the church year, even more so than Christmas. This year, Easter falls on 20 April, not quite as late as it can be - the latest Easter can fall is 25 April - but still late on in the possible range of dates. Our first Easter in the Highlands was 2016, where it fell on 27 March. I remember making a wooden cross for the church which we decorated with daffodils from the church garden. I'll not be doing that this year, as I think the daffs will have passed by then!

However I do remember that cross, knocked together from scrap wood in the garage, became a sign of new life as it turned from rough lumber to something pretty.

After lent, and the associated self reflection which many engage in, Easter is a time of renewal. Easter is far more important than the symbolism attached to it, be that bunnies, chocolate eggs. But these symbols associated with Easter have links with newness of life. As I was writing this, I was looking at other people's writings, and what surprised me was a blog from someone who worked in Human Resources, explaining why in business you should use Easter to re-invent your career, and from a fitness journal on how you should use Easter to change your exercise habits.

So it seems like the message out there is sinking in, and that renewal is good. But that renewal started 2000 or so years ago, with the ultimate renewal, of Jesus going down into death and returning to newness of life. We're reminded at Easter that we are part of that renewal, because he's gone on ahead of us. Easter is a season of new beginnings, and in your own way, may you come out of it renewed.

I just thought I'd give you an update on all that I'm doing just now. First of all, I had my 6-month review last week and the church thinks I'm Ok to continue training. This means that in a few months I could start looking at vacant charges and make tentative approaches to becoming their Minister. But if there isn't a vacant charge, well officially I have been, and will continue to be, an Ordained Local Minister, and in that role it's expected we do Sunday worship alongside our regular day jobs. That's what I was doing before I joined Old High St Stephen's, and if there's no church work in the short term, it's what I'll continue doing. I'll be fine!

I'm continuing to spend time at the hospice as part of my training. I've now had my official induction where I found that they have 200 paid staff plus a further 900 volunteers in the hospice, the shops, and out in the community. And all of them are absolutely wonderful people, especially Norma the Hospice Chaplain, who has been very supportive.

And there's the usual round of church conferences and online sessions to go through. Joy! On top of this, Susan and I are off to London for the marathon on 27 April. Thanks to all who have supported as we fundraise for Maggie's - so far we've raised over £4,000. Hopefully in May we can put our feet up! REVIEW OF CHURCH ROLL There is a need to review the church roll in preparation for the vote on the union. It was agreed that this should be dealt with very soon. There is a need to update information held under data protection regulations on a regular basis. Once this has been completed a copy of the roll will be available for members to review. Any one, who attends worship on a regular basis at OHSS and is not a member of another congregation, can be added as an adherent or by resolution of the Kirk Session. Members on the supplementary roll do not have a vote. Only in-person voting is permitted.
